Zerubbabel Masonic Engagement Award

Throughout your Masonic degrees, you were taught to build a "temple of character" to honor yourself as a Man and a Mason. Symbolic lessons were taught to you, using King Solomon's Temple as an overriding symbol for the journey you undertook as you knocked on the door of Freemasonry.

According to Biblical history, Solomon's Temple did not endure long. Eventually the Jewish people found themselves captive and exiled from their land and their Temple. Many generations later, a man named Zerubbabel was chosen to lead the People back to the land, and rebuild the Temple.

In much the same way, as a new member of the fraternity, you are now in Zerubbabel's place– previous generations have built this fraternity before you, but it is now your duty to make the fraternity your own.

The Zerubbabel award is a recognition program intended to reward new Masonic Brothers (in their first two years of membership) who get involved with Masonic activities at a local level.
