At this point now in the early part of the year, I have had the opportunity to visit with brethren from not only the Lucky 13th District, but also the 7th, 12th, 17th, 19th, 23rd and 24th districts. We have been to four Grand Master's receptions, and in my humble (and somewhat selfish) opinion, our reception in January has been the highlight thus far.

Rienzi and Other Animals of War

RWB. Robert Kishler Past District Deputy Grand Master



Phil Sheridan was a swarthy Irishman, 5'5", with long arms and short legs, and an unforgettable bullet- shaped head. He had worked as a store clerk before the war.

Rienzi, his 3 yr. old horse, was a gift from the officers of the 2nd Michigan Cavalry in 1862. He was named after the Mississippi town near where they were camped.

From 1862 to 1865, Rienzi was in 45 engagements, 19 pitch battles, and 2 cavalry charges.

The most famous event involving Rienzi occurred on October 19, 1864. Sheridan had been to Washington, D. C., for a meeting and was on his way back to camp at Cedar Creek. He spent the night in Winchester, VA, about 75 miles from Washington and 14 miles from Cedar Creek. On the morning of the 19th, Sheridan learned of General Jubal Early's Confederate forces attacking his army at the Cedar Creek camp. Sheridan rode Rienzi at full speed toward the sounds of the battle to find his army in full retreat.

Appearing through the smoke and haze of the battle, Sheridan rode through his troops yelling, "Men, by God we'll whip 'em yet. We'll sleep in our own camp tonight."

His men did rally and eventually defeated General Jubal Early's army and turned the tide of the war in the Shenandoah Valley. For years after, soldiers recalled the sight of Sheridan on his huge black horse, riding through their ranks, spurring them on in battle.

This young horse helped Sheridan win the day and with that good news, helped Lincoln win reelection against McClellan.

Sheridan, in recognition of the victory, re-named Rienzi Winchester after the name of the town he rode from. Sheridan and Winchester finished the war together. Winchester was part of the gathering of some of the greatest and best known war horses in history at the Appomattox Court House at the surrender of the army of northern Virginia.

Along with Winchester were Cincinnati (Grant's horse), Traveller (Lee's horse), Blackie (Meade's horse), and Duke (Sherman's horse), along with many others.

The taxidermy mounting of Winchester can be be seen at the Hall of the Armed Forces Museum at the Smithsonian in Washington, D.C., still wearing the general's saddle and accessories.

Among the 5,000 Union casualties in that battle, one general was killed and three generals were wounded. The casualty rate for the Confederates was high: about 4,000 of 15,500. Two Confederate generals were killed and four were wounded. Participants in the battle included two future presidents of the United States, two future governors of Virginia, a former vice president of the United States, and a colonel whose grandson, George S. Patton became a famous general in World War II.

Other animals of war include the following: Sergeant Stubby - Boston Terrier in WWI – warned of gas and chased away rats. Sgt. Stubby: An Unlikely Hero is a 2018 movie based on historical facts. Cher Ami – Homing pigeon in WWI – saved 194 lives by carrying messages to Allied Forces, shot down but revived and kept flying. Sergeant Reckless – Was a horse from a Korean mare and Mongolian sire, made 51 solo trips to the front, carrying 9000 lbs. total.

Traveller – Lee's gray horse stood 16 hands high. Both Lee and Traveller are buried at Washington and Lee University in Lexington, Virginia.

Cincinnati – Grant's bay horse stood 17.2 hands high **Lexington/ Duke** – Sherman's horses **Rienzi** – Sheridan's black horse

Prince Hall Freemasonry




February is Black History Month, which means it's time for us to reflect on the Black trailblazers, musicians, and athletes who also called themselves Freemasons. As men of the craft we strive to foster inclusion, diversity, and equality both in and out of lodge. Join us in recognizing the impact these men have had on our

fraternity and the world. Prince Hall Freemasonry, dating back to the Revolutionary War, was founded when Worshipful Brother Prince Hall erected African Lodge #459, the first lodge of Blacks in America.

A Brief Introduction:

Prince Hall Freemasonry is the oldest recognized and continuously active organization founded by African Americans. Prince Hall Freemasonry had its beginnings on March 6, 1775 when Prince Hall (ca. 1748-1807), an abolitionist and civil rights activist, along with fourteen other free black men were initiated into freemasonry. These men later organized African Lodge No. 1 on July 3, 1775. In 1784 they petitioned the Grand Lodge of England for a charter; it was granted and African Lodge No. 1 became African Lodge No. 459 of Boston, Massachusetts. This organization laid the foundation for African American citizenship, education, and for the improvement of the condition of blacks.
